OUR COURSE DETAILS

The EPRS (Religious Studies) A-Level Course is a two-year programme of investigation into philosophy, ethics, and Christian theology. It is an ideal way for diligent young minds to develop critical, analytical, and evaluative skills, as well as social, cultural, and emotional intelligence, all of which will be of great value in a wide array of workplaces and higher education courses.

The chosen specification for EPRS is the OCR exam board, on the basis of it being accessible, yet challenging; well-balanced between content knowledge and written skill; and an excellent preparation for university, owing to it placing high priority on the ability to debate and reason.

The first year of the course lays the foundations for the second year, in which all topics covered in the first year (across philosophy, ethics, and Christian thought) provide the context for the more challenging material in the second year. Philosophy and ethics are taught concurrently with Christian thought, providing a balance between religious and secular thought throughout the course.



EMPLOYABILITY

There are many careers available which use EPRS, whether philosophical (law and politics to name but two), ethical (research ethics is a key area of employment), or theological (https://pathways.churchofengland.org/search)

PREPARING FOR STUDY

It is essential that students on the EPRS course have excellent essay writing skills. As such, we expect all candidates to be willing and able to:

- Demonstrate a genuine enthusiasm for the course
- Write 2-3 sides in 40 minutes
- Provide strengths and weaknesses when considering an argument
- Evaluate ideas (i.e. how strong or weak they are)

Read both a chapter of a book, and at least one article, every week
