



### OUR COURSE DETAILS

We have chosen the AQA English Literature B specification as it is a challenging, diverse and rewarding course that offers students the chance to read and engage with a wide range of literature, through the lens of genre and theory. Students develop a wide range of skills, such as the ability to read critically, analyse, evaluate and undertake independent research. All these skills are valuable for both further study and future employment. Along with preparing for two rigorous linear examinations on the literary genres of Tragedy and Crime (representing 80% of the course) students will produce two pieces of non-exam assessment, worth 20% of the final A Level grade. Offering clear progression from GCSE, the course allows students to build on the skills and knowledge already gained and prepare for their next steps.
