

## Dear Parent/Carer

Your young person has only been at Bilborough for a few days, and I hope everything is going well for them. It takes time to adjust to new ways of working, but as I walk around the college meeting as many students as possible, it seems that they are happy and settling in well.

Lanyard Policy: From Monday, 16th September, our no lanyard no entry policy will be activated. If students forget their lanyard, they will not be permitted to use the college buses or enter the building, they will be required to return home. If a student has lost their lanyard, a replacement can be purchased, at the cost of £3.50 via Wisepay and they will be allowed entry. Please note, this may result in a delay in entering the building, so we highly recommend that they work their own 'lanyard-check' into their morning routine to avoid this. Issuing replacement cards automatically deactivates the lost ID card.

If your young person has **safeguarding** needs and they arrive at college without their lanyard, they should speak to reception, who will contact a safeguarding person.

**Learning support** and/or **wellbeing** - If you have trouble planning independent/unexpected travel because of your support need, please ask reception to alert a member of the learning support team.
